The spelling that I've seen before is CAXIXI but it is pronounced as kasheshe. Construction: A natural gourd bottom with a woven basket upper section. Inside are seeds that look a little like coffee beans. There is a handle on the top for holding the instrument, but it is also often held by the basket area. When the beans are shake m of the instrument, a hard sound results as d bottom (KA) When the beams are shak ubbina-like sound results (She-She-
